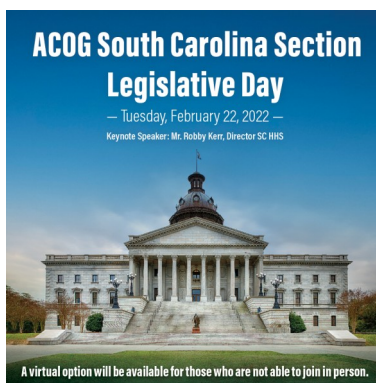

## ACOG SC Section Legislative Report Dawn Bingham, MD, MPH, FACOG ACOG SC Section Vice Chair and Legislative Chair February 22, 2022

ACOG SC Section Legislative Day – Held on 2/22/22. Over 40 faculty, residents, and medical students participated in the Keynote speech by SC DHHS Director Rob Kerr on Medicaid Extension in South Carolina, Legislative Updates with our ACOG lobbyist, and meetings with legislators, similar to ACOG CLC. A resolution recognizing 2/22/22 as ‘ACOG Day of Appreciation’ was read on the floor of the House of Representatives by Rep. Beth Bernstein, and our incoming SC ACOG Treasurer, Dr. Tricia Seal was introduced on the floor of the House and Senate and served as the ‘Doctor of the Day’ for the Statehouse.



Medicaid Extension – Working with coalition partners, SC ACOG has helped to secure 12-month Medicaid Extension for postpartum women in South Carolina. This was heralded and supported by SC DHHS director, Mr. Rob Kerr, and has received wide bipartisan support. Extending Medicaid coverage for new mothers from 60 days to 12 months postpartum will help address the negative social and public health effects that we bear from poor birth outcomes, particularly those born in rural and traditionally underserved communities in South Carolina.

Legislative Advocacy Resident Elective – created and implemented by Junior Fellow Chair, Dr. Katee Wyant, and approved by USC-School of Medicine Department of OB/GYN. To be available for a SC chief resident to interface and work on legislative projects with coalition partners over a month rotation period.

Perinatal Integration bill S379 – Dr. Amy Crockett offered testimony supporting midwifery colleagues in South Carolina’s Birth Centers in their request for additional regulation and oversight from the Department of Health and Environmental Control. Greater integration of the Licensed Midwives and Birth Centers with the rest of the maternity care system in South Carolina will improve outcomes for mothers and babies in our State. Advocated for amendments to the bill that will increase patient safety and quality initiatives – including distance to travel, formal relationships with physician consultants, and accreditation by Commission for the Accreditation of Birth Centers (CABC), similar to accreditation by the Joint Commission.

## Legislative Report (Cont)...

Abortion ban ‘Trigger bill’ S988 – ACOG SC Section Officers provided testimony and expert witness and lobbying against this “trigger law” which would make all abortion illegal in SC should the Supreme Court overrule Roe. This would make it a felony for a physician to perform an abortion with a penalty of 2 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine. This is criminalization of physicians acting within the scope of their training and the standard of care for their profession. *S.988 uses language referring to a fertilized egg as a person.* This ‘Personhood’ language has far-reaching implications beyond just abortion access. At the time of this report, bill is still in committee.

Medication Abortion Bill S907 - ACOG SC Section officers provided testimony, expert witnesses, and lobbying against this “abortion reversal” bill that requires physicians to tell patients that they can “reverse” a medical abortion with high doses of progesterone. This bill is essentially a medical misinformation mandate. At the time of this report, bill is still in committee.

SCMA resolution against criminalization of physicians – Working through SCMA House of Delegates and SCMA Inter-Specialty legislative Council, Dr. Bingham (ACOG) and Dr. Debbie Greenhouse (AAP) and Dr. Griffin Cuspid (AAFP) were able to introduce and gather support for the passage of a SCMA resolution denouncing the criminalization of physicians providing care within the scope of their training and within the standard of care. This resolution has been utilized as a tool to educate and convince legislators that the SC medical community has a united base of support in protecting physicians and patient care in spite of polarizing political discourse.

Maternal Health Awareness Day - ACOG Maternal Health Awareness Day was celebrated on Saturday, Jan. 22 and Sunday, Jan. 23 with a Blood Drive on the Prisma Health Richland Hospital campus, sponsored by the SC Section of ACOG. For every blood donation received, The Blood Connection contributed \$10 to Prisma Health Midlands Foundation, to benefit *SimCoach™*, a fully equipped mobile simulation training center led by Prisma Health-University of South Carolina School of Medicine Simulation Center. Through *SimCoach™*, team-based medical simulation training is offered around the state on many complicated procedures and scenarios, including lifesaving measures for mothers and babies. This event brought awareness of maternal health needs in South Carolina, an influx of blood donations, and \$340 raised for *SimCoach™*.
